


It will take time for our students to get used to the new program and curriculum. As stated above, if your child is frustrated or the homework is too difficult for them, please contact your child's teacher so they can help make adjustments if needed. The adoption of a new program takes time. We will continue to build the foundational math knowledge students need in order to be successful in the years to come!
