

Public Health Recommendations for the Screening, Exclusion, and Re-Admittance of III OR Exposed Students for COVID-19 in Schools

The following is based on the most current research. Because people with COVID-19 have reported a wide range of symptoms – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness, the following criteria has been developed to assist schools in identifying presumptive positive COVID-19 cases.

At least **one**: new cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, loss of taste and smell

OR

Students with **two**: fever (measured or subjective), chills, cold/shivering, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea

Students who screen positive should be immediately isolated in the designated area and sent home as soon as possible. Require the symptomatic person to wear a surgical or procedure mask while waiting, if tolerable.

Family Physician for diagnosis/care - We understand it's alarming to have overlapping symptoms with COVID-19. Speak with your doctor to determine the best option.

If COVID-19 testing is needed there are 3 different testing options. <u>The most appropriate testing will be determined by your doctor. The only test option</u> for no symptoms (gray boxes below) is Test Nebraska.

Rapid Test-Results available same day. Send Out Test-Results available on average 1-3 days. Test Nebraska-Results available on average 1-3 days.

Re-Admittance to School

Symptomatic student who tests positive:

Exclude for:

- At least 10 days since symptoms first appeared
 AND:
- At least 24 hours with no fever without feverreducing medication AND:
- Symptoms have improved

Symptomatic student not tested:

Exclude for:

- At least 10 days since symptoms first appeared
 AND:
- At least 24 hours with no fever without feverreducing medication AND:
- Symptoms have improved
 May return to school if a doctor establishes an alternative diagnosis and meets the school's requirements for

readmission.

Symptomatic student who <u>tests</u> negative:

Exclude until

 No fever for 24 hours (or meets the schools requirements for readmission)

AND:

 improved respiratory symptoms

No symptom* student who <u>tests</u> <u>positive</u>:

Exclude for: At least 10 days from positive test

No symptom* student in quarantine not tested:

Exclude until:

- At least 10 days have passed since close contact exposure.
- No COVID-19 symptoms have developed.

MUST continue to self-monitor for symptoms, and wear a mask through day 14.

No symptom* student in quarantine tests negative:

Exclude 7 days if all are met:

- COVID-19 test on day five (5) following their exposure and their test is negative.
- not experiencing symptoms.

MUST continue to self-monitor for symptoms and wear a mask through day 14.

* The only test option for no symptoms (gray boxes) is Test Nebraska.

There is no reason for a student to get a "negative test" to be cleared for return to school. A COVID-19 positive individual does not need a repeat COVID-19 test or a doctor's note to return.
